PARKS AND PLAYGROUNDS

22314

Armory Tot Lot

208 South Royal Street

The Tot Lot is geared toward children ages 2-5 and consists of a large sandbox, double teeter-totter, tunnel slide, double slide, two climbing features, and two bucket swings.

Jefferson Houston Elementary School Park

1501 Cameron Street

This playground is one of the largest in Old Town and has endless equipment and climbing structures! It's just down the street from the Old Town Pool. Parking is easy and there is something for everyone.

Jones Point Park

125 Jones Point Drive

Jones Point features an Adventure Ship structure, climbing equipment, slides, a seesaw, a separate toddler area, and two basketball courts. Jones Point was a shipyard used during World War I. You can see the ship's rudder here along with panels along trails highlighting the history and importance of the shipyard during colonial times.

Lyles Crouch Elementary School Playground

530 South St. Asaph

Lylces Crouch is a good place to go to with older more adventurous kids.

This playground was designed for children from kindergarten through 5th grade, so the climbing structures are higher.

Montgomery Playground

901 North Royal Street

You'll find a fenced dog area, four lighted tennis courts, shaded picnic gazebo, a water fountain, and a playground with slides and climbing equipment at this playground.

Windmill Hill Park (aka: Lee Street Park)

501 South Union Street

This Old Town staple contains a large playground featuring slides, tunnels, monkey bars, a suspension bridge, rope walls, swings, a seesaw, a sand box, a sand volleyball court, basketball courts, and a large field. The park can also be accessed from the 500 South block of Lee Street.

South Royal Street Park

200 South Royal Street Park

This tucked away park encompasses a small playground and sandbox.

PARKS AND PLAYGROUNDS

22301

Beach Park

201 Rucker Place

Located right behind Naomi L.. Brooks Elementary School, Beach Park offers swings, various slides, as well as drinking fountains, seating, and trails for walking/running/bicycling.

East Del Ray Avenue Park Playground

1 and 7 East Del Ray Avenue

Here you'll find a small woodland-themed playground featuring climbing equipment, a slide, and bench seating.

Hooffs Run Park aka Blue Park

18 East Linden Street

Known by locals as "Blue Park," Hooffs Run offers swings, slides, and a sea-saw as well as a community garden and tennis courts!

Judy Lowe Neighborhood Park

7 East Del Ray Avenue

This park/playground is for younger children with a small slide, log tunnel, and benches.

Mount Vernon Elementary Playground

100 East Uhler Avenue

Located just off Mount Vernon Avenue, this large playground offers a popular hangout for children and parents alike!

Naomi L. Brooks Elementary School

600 Russell Road

You'll find a slide, jungle gym, swing, and tennis courts here.

St. Stephens St. Agnes School Playground

400 Fontaine Street

This private school playground is only open to the public on the weekends. Multiple playgrounds are designed for a wide age range including jungle gym, slides, and more.

George Mason Elementary School Playground

2601 Cameron Mills Road

The school backs up to George Mason Park and has a playground, fields and other community facilities.

Chinquapin Park

3210 King Street

Chinquapin Park is a smaller playground next to Alexandria High School. Highlights include slides, a chain link cargo net, pull up bars, tunnels, steering mechanisms, a tic-tac-toe board, and swings. Also located at Chinquapin is an indoor public pool and rec center.

Armistead L. Boothe Park

520 Cameron Station Boulevard

This park includes several different play areas with slides, climbing structures, swings, and a basketball court.

Ben Brenman Park

4800 Brenman Park Drive

Ben Brenman Park is an enclosed playground with a soft, rubber surface. It features slides, swings, rubber stepping stones, and a mini rock climbing wall.

Douglas MacArthur Elementary School Playground

4633 Taney Avenue

This playground features large and small slides, monkey bars, and various climbing apparatuses more appropriate for older children.

Fort Ward Park

4301 West Braddock Road

This historic park features a playground including a rock wall, a chain ladder, a suspension bridge, stepping stones, corkscrew bars, slides and swings. The park also contains numerous picnic areas, an amphitheater and dog exercise area, and houses a Civil War museum.

Holmes Run Park

4000 Holmes Run Parkway

This mulch playground contains swings, monkey bars, climbing equipment, and benches.

Stevenson Square Park

300 Stultz Road

Stevenson Square Park is a quaint community park featuring a basketball court, picnic area, baseball field, and small playground.

PARKS AND PLAYGROUNDS

22305

Beverly Park

620 North Overlook Drive

Affectionately known to locals as “The Pit,” Beverly Park sits on a mulch surface and contains a cargo net, monkey bars, climbers, a zipline slider, four slides, ladders, a corkscrew climber, a mini rock climbing wall, a cargo chain and suspension bridge. The Pit also features an attached playhouse and a small fire truck, a double see-saw, swings, and a large sandbox.

Hume Springs Park

100 Dale Street

Highlights of this small mulch playground include climbing equipment, bucket swings, monkey bars, and a slide.

Lynhaven Park

5 East Reed Avenue

Lynhaven Park contains two metal cargo chain nets, tic-tac-toe boards, a tunnel, steering wheels, swings, and a spring rider that seats four.

Potomac Yard Park Playground & Sprayground

2501 Potomac Avenue

There is something for everyone at Potomac Yard Park which contains two separate fenced playgrounds consisting of rubber surfaces. The toddler playground features small slides, a teeter-totter, swings, a mirror-filled maze, steering wheels, crawling spaces, and tic-tac-toe boards. The older playground includes swings, stepping stumps, metal rings, a cargo chain and dual rock wall, a zip line, teeter-totters, jungle gyms, balance beams and spring beams, slides, and hammocks. In between the two playgrounds is an interactive fountain, along with tennis, basketball and volleyball courts.

Groveton Heights Park
3429 Clayborne Avenue

This small neighborhood playground is comprised of slides, trapeze rings, a fireman's pole, and benches.

Lenclair Park
6625 Lenclair Street

Lenclair Park features swings, slides, tunnels, and monkey bars on both a grass and mulch surface.

Martin Luther King Jr. Park
8115 Fordson Road

This large community park highlights slides, a telescope window, monkey bars, metal rings, steering wheels, a tic-tac-toe board, a rock wall, ladders, swings, and trapeze rings.

Stoneybrooke Park
3900 Stoneybrooke Drive

Stoneybrooke Park is a small mulch playground with swings, slides, tunnels, climbing equipment, and benches.

Collingwood Park
8200 West Boulevard Drive

This massive park offers tennis courts, open space, soccer and baseball fields, and a large playground with slides, swings, and climbing equipment.

Stratford Landing Park
2301 Stirrup Lane

Stratford Landing Park is a large neighborhood playground with swings, slides, climbing equipment, tic-tac-toe-boards, animal rockers, a large field, basketball courts, and tennis courts.

George Washington Grist Mill Park

5512 Mount Vernon Memorial Highway

Located near George Washington's Mount Vernon, this park contains athletic fields for soccer, softball, baseball and football, two full-size basketball courts, a large playground with climbing equipment, and the perimeter of the park has hiking and biking trails that bypass a dog park. This park was once the site of a former farm lane.

Mount Vernon Manor Park

8600 McNair Drive

Mount Vernon Manor Park is tucked away behind a cul-de-sac and entails a baseball field, tennis courts, trails, a picnic area shaded by trees, a playground that has swings, a frog spring rocker, slides, ladders, rings and a spiral climbing gym.

Mount Vernon Woods Park

4014 Fielding Street

This park comprises a small mulch playground with swings, slides, and climbing equipment.

Muddy Hole Farm Park

7941 Kidd Street

Muddy Hole Farm Park consists of tennis courts, a soccer field, three basketball courts, picnic tables with a grill, and a playground with tunnels, slides, and climbing equipment.

Woodley Hills Park

8710 Old Mount Vernon Road

This neighborhood park features tennis courts and a playground with slides, swings,

a tic-tac-toe board, a steering wheel, ladders, rings, and climbing equipment.

Chessie's Big Backyard

6601 Telegraph Road

Inside Lee District Park, highlights of Chessie's Big Backyard include a climbing web, climbing ropes, rocks, tree stumps, stone walls, a rope ladder, suspension bridges, and various ramps. Interactive gadgets throughout the playground allow kids to track the sounds of a skunk, raccoon, river otter and alligator, and search for woodland animals along the rubber surface.

Bren Mar Park

6324 Edsall Road

Bren Mar Park encompasses several slides, a suspension bridge, climbing blocks, a pull up bar, a steering wheel, a picnic area, and a baseball field.

22315

Hayfield Park

7611 Hayfield Road

This mulch playground consists of stepping stumps, whisper phones, animal and baseball tic-tac-toe boards, a mini climbing wall, a rock mountain, slides, and a crawling tunnel. The playground is accompanied by a circular stone area with stone benches and a large grass field.

POOLS & WATER PARKS

CITY OF ALEXANDRIA POOLS

Cameron Run Regional Park

4001 Eisenhower Avenue

Great Waves Waterpark offers a wave pool, four-story water slides, and a snack bar, plus a shallow-water play pool.

Chinquapin Park Recreation Center

3210 King Street

This 25-meter indoor pool offers visitors aquatic sports and fitness classes as well as access to diving boards.

Old Town Pool

1609 Cameron Street

This outdoor pool offers not only entertainment in the water, but also on dry ground with a tot playground adjacent to the pool and picnic area. This pool is the only Alexandria pool located in Old Town.

Warwick Pool

3301 Landover Street

This 25-yard outdoor pool encompasses a picnic area and playground to keep your kids entertained.

Memorial Pool

901 Wythe Street

Located inside Charles Houston Recreation Center, this small pool with beach entry and spray features is ideal for families with young children, as well as adults seeking therapeutic benefits. Admission wristbands

must be purchased at the Recreation Center and are limited to 75 participants at any one time.

PRIVATE SOUTH ALEXANDRIA POOLS

Hollin Meadows Swim and Tennis Club

2500 Woodlawn Trail

Located in the Hollin Hills Community, this close knit community club encompasses a five-plus acre complex with a 25-meter pool, lap lanes, an enclosed wading pool for toddlers, five tennis courts, a ping pong table, cornhole, a children's play area, and an exercise area. Swimming and tennis instruction are available, and various family activities and social events are offered.

Belle Haven Country Club

6023 Fort Hunt Road

Located just south of Old Town, Belle Haven Country Club offers both an eight-lane pool and a kiddie pool for those under six years of age. The club also includes eight outdoor clay tennis courts and five indoor DecoTurf courts, allowing for year-round play. Golfers will love the 18 hole Arthur Hills-designed course at Belle Haven. The club offers a variety of teams, tournaments, and social activities for its members.

Hollin Hills Pool

1602 Paul Spring Road

Hollin Hills Pool is located in the Hollin Hills Community and includes aerobics classes, swimming instructions, two water slides, a separate 30-foot shaded wading pool for toddlers, and a playground area. It also offers dinner at the pool, food trucks, social events, and a private party area.

Little Hunting Park

7000 Canterbury Lane

Little Hunting Park is located on a secluded 10 acres just south of Old Town. Facilities include a six-lane, 25-meter pool, a separate diving well with diving board, a wading pool for children five and under, a play area and swings, four lighted tennis courts available year-round, and various sport courts (including basketball, shuffleboard, four-square, and tennis).

Mount Vernon Park

8042 Fairfax Road

Set on nearly 13 acres of wooded parkland, Mount Vernon Park is the focus of summer activity for 600 families. MVP members enjoy three pools (25-meter, 50-meter, and wading), four lighted tennis courts (open year round), a large picnic area with grills, grass volleyball court, a children's playground, a covered pavilion, and a one-acre pond for fishing.

Riverside Gardens Pool

8633 Buckboard Drive

Located in the back of the Riverside Gardens neighborhood, this club provides a private and safe environment. Facilities consist of a zero-entry shallow pool, a slide for toddlers, a 25-meter pool, a diving board, a pool house with restrooms, showers, and changing rooms, a picnic area, grills, tennis courts, a playground, and a sand volleyball court.

Waynewood Recreation Association

1027 Dalebrook Drive

Located in the heart of the Waynewood neighborhood, this pool serves as a gathering spot for the community. Facilities entail two 25-meter swimming pools, one

with a Duraflex diving board, a waterslide with a 48-foot slide run, a fenced baby wading pool, and over 300 pieces of deck furniture.

Stratford Recreation Association

2300 Brinitzer Way

The Stratford Landing neighborhood has a recently renovated pool which includes a zero-entry shallow end with bubblers at the entrance as well as a fenced-in baby pool with covered area. The concessions area has covered seating and tables along with vending machines.

Highland Park Swim and Tennis Club

6400 Highland Drive

Located two blocks from Lee District Park, this club includes a six-lane swimming pool, a large baby pool for children under the age of seven years, a diving well – with two diving boards, two tennis courts, and sport courts for basketball, hockey, volleyball, and shuffleboard.

Mount Vernon Country Club

5111 Old Mill Road

Situated on George Washington's former farmland, the Mount Vernon Country Club offers a 25-meter competition-quality pool along with a wading pool and poolside grill. Children have the opportunity to join the Club's competitive swim team. Its members also enjoy a championship golf course and a variety of social activities.

Virginia Hills Pool

6301 Prospect Terrace

Located in the center of the Virginia Hills Community. Facilities include a six-lane 25-meter main pool with a separate diving well, slide, and shallow area, a fenced baby/toddler pool with sprinkler, extensive deck, and lawn area for sunbathing or relaxing.

KID FRIENDLY RESTAURANTS

Dairy Godmother

2301 Mount Vernon Avenue

For Wisconsin-style frozen custard, take a trip to Del Ray to visit the Dairy Godmother (highly recommended by Allison)! What makes frozen custard different from ice cream? Well, it has at least 1.4% pasteurized egg yolk, at least 10% milk fat, and is made in a special machine using a very specific technique. The result is an amazingly creamy and smooth summer treat. Vanilla and Chocolate custard are available daily, plus a Flavor of the Day. The Dairy Godmother also offers an incredible variety of sorbets (dairy-free) in enticing flavors like Lemon Lavender, Strawberry Balsamico, Orange Blossom, Pineapple with Cilantro, Cucumber with Fresh Mint, Pear with Vanilla, and many more.

Del Ray Cafe

205 East Howell Avenue

Served on Saturdays, Sundays and major holidays, the brunch at Del Ray Cafe is delicious. The brunch menu consists of many starters, eggs, and omelets, including the option to create-your-own omelet. Also, sweet or savory crêpes are available at any time during the day.

Holy Cow

2312 Mount Vernon Avenue

Looking for delicious hand cut fries, burgers, and shakes? Try out Holy Cow in Del Ray. The relaxed counter service environment is perfect for families and the restaurant is stroller-friendly. The outdoor seating is perfect for when the weather warms up. Holy Cow's kids menu is great for picky eaters.

Lena's Wood-Fired Pizza and Tap

401 East Braddock Road

Lena's, a member of the Alexandria Restaurant Partners, has wood-fired pizza and Italian food. Try the Diavola pizza with salami, mozzarella, fried kale, and ghost pepper honey (don't worry it's not too spicy) or stick to the classic Margherita pizza.

Los Tios Grill

2615 Mount Vernon Avenue

This local favorite Tex-Mex grill sits just on the edge of the Avenue, in Del Ray. With huge portion sizes and unbeatable, authentic tastes, Los Tios Grill is Del Ray's go-to spot for school fundraisers, birthday parties, and any other excuse to enjoy the environment inside and out. Los Tios has the best chips and salsa in town, hands down; combined with incredible service and an affordable selection, it is hard to beat this top Del Ray restaurant!



Pork Barrel BBQ

2312 Mount Vernon Avenue

When Pork Barrel BBQ opened in 2011, it quickly became Del Ray's hottest restaurant. In what is already considered the Avenue's most visited block, Pork Barrel joined Del Ray's famous St. Elmo's Coffee Pub, The Dairy Godmother, and its sister restaurant Holy Cow. Pork Barrel brings nationally ranked BBQ to the heart of Del Ray, attracting BBQ lovers from all over the region to this family-friendly restaurant. It also features arcade games, a sports bar, and outdoor seating. After indulging in an award-winning sandwich, the "Del Ray" thing to do is stroll down the block for frozen custard or pastry at the Dairy Godmother.

Gustave Boulangerie

2213 Mt Vernon Ave

This French bistro open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner has a side yard, 'le jardin', where kids can play and adults can grab a drink.

Taqueria el Poblano

2400 Mount Vernon Avenue

Voted in Zagat's Top 10 best Mexican restaurants in the D.C. area (2014), Mount Vernon Avenue's Taqueria el Poblano's margaritas are said to be "made with lots of TLC." The restaurant has a fabulous neighborhood vibe and very lively atmosphere. Its extensive menu features traditional Mexican favorites like tacos, chile rellenos, enchiladas, and burritos. The friendly and welcoming service at Taqueria el Poblano is yet another reason to stop by!

Duck Donuts

Originally from North Carolina's Outer Banks, these sinful donuts have made their way to Alexandria. Duck Donuts are delicious, handmade, and fried to perfection. The toppings are custom-made to your choosing. Make sure you try their signature Maple & Bacon or Powdered Sugar & Blackberry Drizzle donuts!

Fontaine

119 S Royal St

Mai Thai

6 King Street

Enjoy authentic Thai cuisine on the waterfront in Old Town Alexandria. After dinner stop by Pop's for ice cream and stroll down the Old Town waterfront with the family.

Mason Social

Table Talk's generous servings will surely fill you up for the day. With a variety of menu options, everyone in the family is bound to find something they like with this restaurant.





Vola's

Offering one of the best waterfront dining views in Old Town, Vola's is a fabulous spot for a seafood lunch. Try the Chesapeake Bay Chowder, made with blue crab, to start. For your main dish, try the Lobster Roll, the Blackened Grouper Sandwich, or Firecracker Shrimp Tacos — with a side of Old Bay Fries, of course. The Red Hot Apple Cobbler is the perfect way to end your meal, with its special ingredient of spicy red hot candies and cooling cinnamon ice cream. Located in the Torpedo Factory, Vola's offers both indoor and outdoor seating as well as the Hi-Tide lounge, a throwback cocktail lounge.

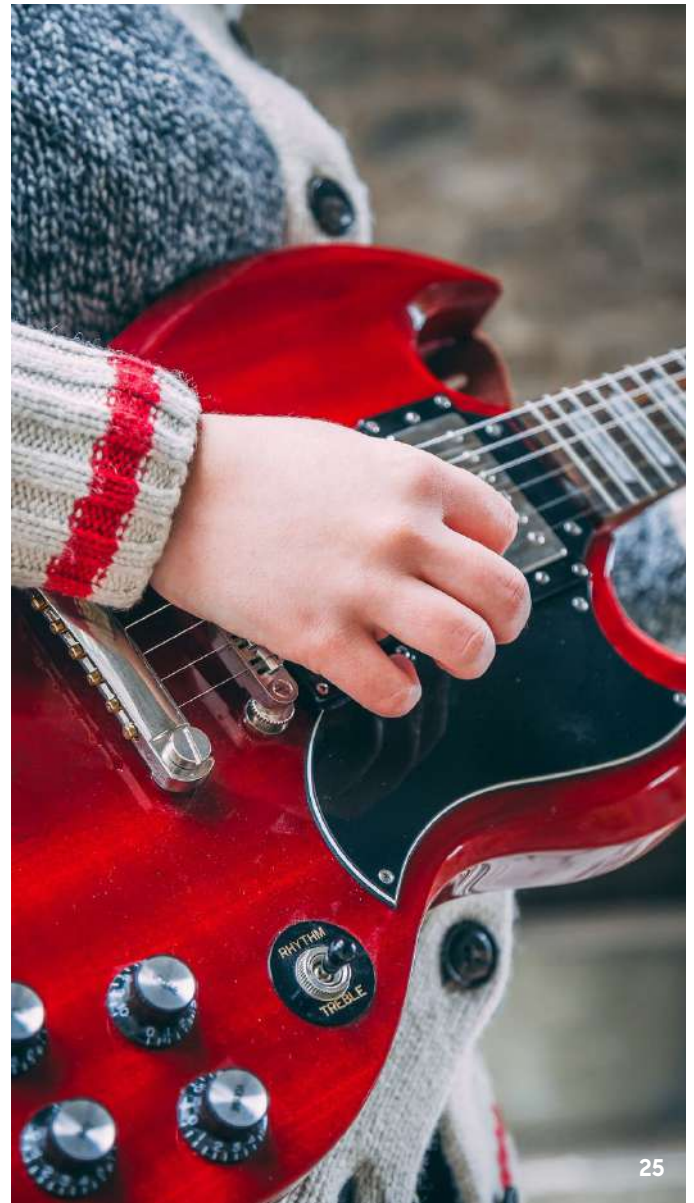
